

### Executive Director's Corner



Thank you for all of the support you have given Artemis Center this past year. As we navigate the pandemic and its impact on survivors, your generous assistance has allowed us to continue offering critical services, including the Montgomery County Domestic Violence Hotline, safety planning, emotional support, material support (i.e., your donated food, hygiene items, and gift and gas cards) and therapy for survivors and their children.

Artemis Center is Dayton's only dedicated agency focused solely on domestic violence survivors and their children. We ensure that the needs of survivors will never become secondary, specifically to victims of crimes such as sexual assault or human trafficking, which are often more readily understood by the public. Artemis Center works to educate our community on the effects of domestic violence on families and on our community as a whole. Did you know that Artemis Center is only one of five non-shelter domestic violence agencies in the state? The majority of survivors never go to a shelter, but over the past 35 years more than 100,000 survivors right here in the Miami Valley region have received Artemis Center services.

### Highlights From 2021 Include:

- During the first 11 months, Artemis staff answered over 6,000 crisis calls, met with over 300 individuals who came to Artemis without an appointment, and provided over 600 child therapy sessions.
- The Artemis Center mission was updated to: "Working with the community to empower survivors to heal and live free of domestic violence." This statement, I believe, more accurately reflects the partnership between Artemis and the community in our efforts to help survivors get safe and heal.
- Artemis participated with Ohio Domestic Violence Network (ODVN) and local lawmakers in Advocacy Day at the State House in Columbus. This joint effort persuaded the Ohio General Assembly to increase the state budget line-item for domestic violence services from \$1 million to \$7.5 million for the next 2 years. (The state budget provided Artemis Center with \$80,000 in operating funds in 2021.)
- I was asked and agreed to serve on the ODVN Board of Directors. This will give Artemis a voice at the state level, allowing us to advance our work on behalf of survivors. Our collaborative relationship with ODVN goes back decades and has always made us better and more successful advocates for domestic violence survivors.
- June marked my 25th anniversary of employment at this amazing agency. I am humbled by this honor and feel so incredibly proud of our services, the professionalism of our staff, and our commitment to meeting survivors where they are in their lives. I remain energized by our strong collaborations with community partners, too many to name, who stand beside us in their commitment to serve survivors and their families.

Lastly, I want to take this opportunity to thank our staff. Their hard work and dedication are the reason so many former clients tell us that Artemis Center saved their lives.

On behalf of myself, our staff and the Board of Directors, thank you for all of your support of survivors and the Artemis Center mission. We look forward to continuing this vital work in 2022.
